Garbage Disposal and Collection Bylaw No. 200

A bylaw to regulate the disposal and collection of garbage within the Genelle Improvement District.

The board of trustees of the Genelle Improvement District ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Definitions

1. In this bylaw:
 - a. Garbage means any and all rejected, abandoned or discarded wastes excluding recyclable materials, garden refuse, car batteries and other hazardous materials, and any object or substance that is too large to be placed in a regulation container.
 - b. Garden refuse means grass clippings, leaves, plants, branches, trees and tree prunings.
 - c. Garbage Container means
 - i. A metal or plastic container designed as a garbage can complete with handles and friction fit or snap-lock lid, with a maximum capacity of one hundred and twenty-one litres, or
 - ii. A plastic garbage bag.
 - d. Garbage Collector means any person granted a contract by the trustees of the Genelle Improvement District.

Collection Agreement with Private Contractor

2. The improvement district may enter into an agreement with a private contractor for the purpose of garbage collection and removal within the improvement district's boundaries.
3. Any agreement entered into with a private contractor must be approved by a majority of the trustees and shall be executed by two trustees and the district administrator.

General

4. The owner or occupier of every premise within the district to which the provisions of this bylaw apply must:
 - a. use a garbage container and ensure its lid is fastened securely;
 - b. on the day garbage is collected, and at a time before it is collected, place the garbage container within 5 feet of the street along which the garbage collector travels; and
 - c. must ensure that a garbage container does not exceed 22.5 (50 lbs) when full.

Application of Bylaw

5. The provisions of this bylaw apply to and are binding upon both the owner and occupier of each premise within the district, which is occupied or used for any purpose, unless exemption is authorized by the trustees.
6. Any owner or occupier seeking to be exempt from the application of the bylaw must make a written request with reasons for an authorization from the trustees.
7. This bylaw repeals Bylaw No. 133.
8. This bylaw may be cited as the "Garbage Disposal and Collection Bylaw".

INTRODUCED and given first reading by the Trustees on the 18th day of November, 2008.
